

First STEM Ambassador to Represent Geography Education

In November 2019, Susan Caldis (President, GTANSW & ACT) was selected on merit to attend Science Meets Parliament (SMP) as a delegate of the Institute of Australian Geographers and the Australian Geography Teachers Association. SMP is the annual event hosted by Science and Technology Australia (STA) and it is held in Canberra.

As a participant, Susan had to communicate a policy, and pitch an in-practice example relevant to her field of expertise. To do so. Susan drew on the following recommendation from Geography: Shaping Australia's Future. that Geography be recognised as a partial STEM subject. The pitch was 'Geography Education; Geography as a STEM subject' with the in-practice example taken from a GeoSTFM unit being implemented in a local school to teach Changing Nations.

In March 2020, Susan was appointed, again on merit, as one of STA's 16 STEM Ambassadors. Susan is the first STEM Ambassador for geography education. In this role, Susan will work alongside Mr Trent Zimmerman MP to help bridge the gap between science and government in Australia.

The focus will be to build connections between parliament and the broader STFM sector regarding policy and practice, and to enable federal politicians to gain a deeper understanding of the potential impact of science, technology, engineering and mathematics in Australia. In doing so, Susan will also advocate for geography education to become more visible in STFM education and for geography to become formally recognised in policy and practice as a STEM subject.

The STEM field plays an important role in shaping Australia's health and wellbeing, economic prosperity and environmental sustainability and the discipline of Geography has an important contribution to make in such areas.

Since March 2020, Susan has completed STEM Ambassador training sessions, with more to come. She also had the opportunity to meet with Mr Zimmerman to discuss their vision for the work ahead in the STEM Ambassadors program.

2020 Vision and Operational procedures involve three themes for WA Geography:

- Service to the classroom Geography teacher via PD's, Workshops and Conference.
- Support to the Yr 7 12 geography students via Revision seminars and Student PI's.
- Strengthen Geography profile discipline and connection to future careers via HaSS packages and electronic resources.

Five Teacher Professional
Development days are
being offered. Targeting
inexperienced, new and
returning HaSS/geography
teachers, these TPD's include
Workshop based professional
learning, Conference, Planning
and implementing effective
incursions and excursions and a

Yr 11 and 12 Planning Day. Two teacher PD's were successfully presented. COVID-19 has temporarily impacted other events.

Two Student Professional
Learning Seminars are being
offered. Their aim is to present
short, condensed and
concentrated case study content
that is directly linked to the Year
12 ATAR course. The first was
postponed due to COVID-19,
however the second is being
advertised and will run, thus
offering support to Year 12
ATAR students.

Promotion of geography is continuing through planned activities: revision seminars in second semester will run; Conference will occur in August (teacher attendance will be capped at 100 as a result of COVID-19 restrictions); the Joseph Gentilli Award honouring

and recognising outstanding work completed by a geography teacher will be announced at Conference as will the Young Geographer of the Year competition – years 5 to 12.

Finally, publications have been keeping many on the committee busy. Though COVID-19 has been disruptive to 'normal proceedings', GAWA was fortunate to be published in the West Australian newspaper (24th February) with an article titled "Geography 'vital now' for students". This article recognises the importance of geography as a school subject helping students understand the links between climate change and bushfires.

GHTANT

As with all associations, GHTANT's plans for 2020 have been impacted by COVID-19 restrictions. Although for the most part teaching has continued as usual, physical distancing and travel restrictions prevented face-toface professional learning.


GHTANT was fortunate that our mini-conference for March occurred before restrictions were implemented. 13 teachers attended our event at St Philip's College, Alice Springs. This event occurred in conjunction with the English Teachers Association, and Rosalie Triolo from Monash University attended to support history teachers. GHTANT president Steve Hawkins presented one geographical-related session on Infographics, a repeat of a session run at the 2019 Festival of Teaching in Darwin. This session explored online tools

such as Infogram and Visme can be used to present data in a visually interesting and interactive way.

As with other associations. GHTANT worked to create additional resources for our members to support distance learning, a process that was limited due to the voluntary nature of our association and the pressure placed on our members due to COVID-19 uncertainty. However, we were able to develop a self-paced hazards unit for Year 7 and 8 Geography, as well as some general resources on effective research. We were fortunate that teaching continued in Term 2 as normal, but some of our members are using (or are planning to use) these resources.

GHTANT is hopeful that Semester 2 will provide opportunities for face-to-face professional learning. We have been exploring the possibility of engaging She-Maps to run some drone workshops and hope to run workshops on local fieldwork opportunities. With interstate travel restrictions easing for the Northern Territory prior to Term 3, we will be better placed to plan these events, though caution remains a priority with our planning. The COVID-19 pandemic is far from over, and reduced border restrictions means local cases in the Northern Territory may eventuate.

The Annual General Meeting occurred on 27 November 2019. Lorraine Chaffer stepped down as president having completed a three-year term, and the Council would like to thank her for her service to the Association as President. The Association has 620 members.

In January 2020, our Executive was compelled to act due to the extent of devastation to environments, places, human and more-than-human species caused by the bushfires. A public statement of support to geography teachers in fireaffected communities was released in response to the situation and in alignment with the statement issued by the Australian Academy of Sciences. Other action undertaken included the provision of a complimentary package of Geography teaching resources to fire-affected schools; targeting Annual Conference scholarships towards geography teachers in fire-affected schools; holding future regional conferences in fire-affected communities to support the 'Empty Esky' and 'Spend with them' initiatives.

The COVID-19 pandemic required adjustment to the conduct of Council meetings and the professional learning program:

- The Annual Conference is on-hold pending government advice about group restrictions.
- The face-to-face HSC Student Lectures are now a package available for purchase and include a set of recorded lectures and supporting resources.
- The proposed study tour to China is cancelled.

- The webinar program, journal, support of the charity Picture You in Agriculture, and the Association developed online learning courses continue as usual.
- Café Conversations emerged as a new no-fee, online networking focused initiative.
- A selected curation of classroom-ready resources from previous editions of the journal are now available on the Association website as free-toaccess articles.

We have commenced presentation of a series of online 'twilight' professional development sessions for members. The format is a handson guide through some practical skills developments related to the new senior geography syllabus. As teachers navigate their first implementation of the new assessment there is a growing demand for professional development.


Recent Activities

Professional learning was halted earlier this year, however, we are now in a position where this can resume and planning for this is now underway.



The GTAV has been significantly disrupted since March by the response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The impacts of initial social-distancing regimes in our office were soon followed by the decision for all staff to work remotely from home with its attendant need for regular telecommunication and coordination.
